





With You Along the Way

GENEROSITY IS NOT A PROBLEM

In 2 Corinthians 9:6-11 (NIV 1984), it is written:

Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work. As it is written:

"He has scattered abroad his gifts to the poor; his righteousness endures forever."

Now he who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness. You will be made rich in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God.

CONTEXT = The Apostle Paul wrote to commend the believers in Corinth for their support of the church in Jerusalem. A famine had occurred in Judah, and the Gentile churches Paul had founded were stepping up to support their Jewish-Christian brothers and sisters in their time of need.

COMMENT = Paul reminded them of the Principle of Sowing and Reaping, a fundamental truth he also taught in Galatians 6:7-10. This Principle simply affirms that our harvest is largely dependent on our planting. In the natural world, the type of plant harvested is determined by the

type of seed planted. The amount of harvest is limited by the amount of seed planted. In the spiritual world, there are other variables - especially the will of God - but this is a reliable truth.

God inspired the Principle of Sowing and Reaping to motivate us to do good (the type of seed) and be generous (the amount of seed). In this "spiritual agriculture" we are assured there will be a harvest, but it may not be the type of harvest we anticipate, as God may have something different and better in store for us.

Following up on the Principle, Paul established as fact that God empowers all His people to be generous by giving them all they need plus some extra to give away. Isn't this good news? Unlike the government, God does not command "unfunded mandates!" He commands generosity, but He also funds generosity.

If your immediate reaction to this teaching is hesitation or outright denial, be careful to not allow your feelings or experiences to trump what the Bible clearly states to be true. For example, verse eleven promises He will make us RICH IN EVERY WAY. You may not feel "rich" in any way. Your finances may require pinching pennies and nursing nickels, squeezing by until the next check without anything that feels like an extra bit to give away. If so, let me suggest you start at the other end. If the harvest seems lean, take a look at what you're planting. Generosity on the sowing end leads to greater provision for generosity on the harvesting end.

Finally, let's all remember that the best part of the harvest is a crop of THANKSGIVING TO GOD. Generosity in sowing leads to joy in reaping. - Paster Brett
